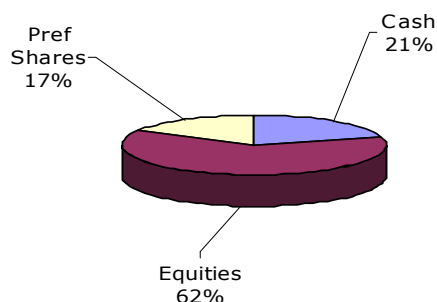
UNIT TRUSTS

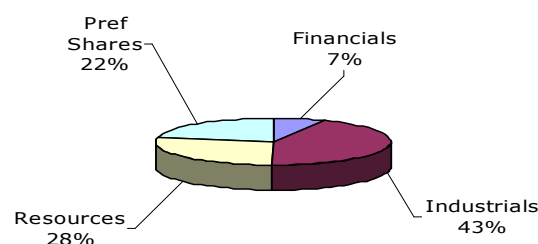
